SHAR-PEI HEALTH SURVEY FUND RAISER



We wanted to give you a quick update on the Health Survey Fund Raiser. From January 1 through March 31 we have had 198 surveys filled out -- looks like the average is 64-65 per month. Last year there were only 233 surveys filled out all year so we are close to reaching that number, but we can do better than this. Every person that owns a Shar-Pei can fill out a survey for each Shar-Pei they own. It helps to fill out surveys for healthy dogs as well. For each survey that is filled out, \$2 will be donated to the Chinese Shar-Pei Charitable Trust and \$2 will be donated to the CSPCA Rescue Fund. The results of the surveys are used to determine the most major health issues in the breed. This information is used in knowing how to best use our research dollars to fund the biggest health issues. The survey only takes about 5 minutes of your time for each dog. It is an investment in the future of the breed and also as a way to help earn money for our two worthy causes. We hope you will take time to contribute to the worthy project.

A Special Announcement

Dear Members of CSPCA,

Here is some very exciting news for all Shar-Pei owners and breeders. Dr. Linda Tintle contacted me today as she was notified that a press release was coming out today about the availability of the long awaited genetic test for Shar-Pei inflammatory disease. See attached press release.

A validated genetic test is now available to measure the copy number variant (CNV) linked to Shar-Pei Autoinflammatory Disease (SPAID), reveals an international collaboration lead by scientists and veterinarians at Uppsala, Sweden and Wurtsboro, New York, USA. Details were published in the April 23 edition of the open-access journal BMC Genomics.

Dr. Tintle said the blood tests will be conducted at a laboratory at Cornell in the US and in Sweden for the EU. She will be providing us with some more information on the process and specifics of testing of our dogs. The final testing process is still being finalized with the testing laboratories. She is sure many will have questions and these will be addressed in time.

For those of you attending nationals this year in York, PA we are fortunate to have Dr. Linda Tintle giving a seminar. I am sure this exciting news will be part of the seminar.

ANNOUNCING A GENETIC TEST FOR SHAR-PEI AUTO INFLAMMATORY DISEASE (SPAID)

A validated genetic test is now available to measure the copy number variant (CNV) linked to Shar-Pei Autoinflammatory Disease (SPAID), reveals an international collaboration lead by scientists and veterinarians at Uppsala, Sweden and Wurtsboro, New York, USA. Details were published in the April 23 edition of the open--access journal BMC Genomics. *http://bmcgenomics.biomedcentral.com/articles/10.1186/s12864--016--2619--0*

This work represents the third step in the group's ongoing research into the relationship between the Shar-Pei dog breed's unique skin appearance and a complex hereditary syndrome, SPAID. In 2011, the team first reported the existence of a duplicated segment of DNA upstream of the gene hyaluronan synthase 2 (HAS2) in Chinese Shar-Pei which was linked to the overproduction of hyaluronan. This molecule is required to form the breed's characteristic thickened and wrinkled skin, however, overproduction can drive the activation of the dog's immune system and result in a periodic fever. The group noted that the dogs with the highest number of duplicated copies carried the highest risk of suffering recurrent fever flares. The term SPAID was coined in 2013 when the same team published the results of their second genetic study showing that fever was only one of five clinical signs that were linked to the same region of the genome. The others were arthritis, otitis, vesicular hyaluronosis and amyloidosis.

The breakthrough in translating their research into a test that could accurately determine the true copy number variation (CNV) of this duplication came through access to new technology, explains senior author of the study, Dr Jennifer Meadows. "The results were so elegant; with droplet digital PCR we were able to follow the inheritance of the CNV over multiple generations, showing how the duplication was passed from parents to their litter." She adds, "This clarity meant we could finally calculate that if a dog has five copies of the CNV on one chromosome, it is four times more likely to suffer SPAID".



A graphic of the process mentioned by Dr Meadows is illustrated. The image shows a sire with a copy number of six (CNV = 6, light blue). This means that he has five copies on one chromosome, and one copy on the other. The dam has a copy number of ten (CNV = 10, dark blue). In this case, there are five copies of the CNV on each of her two chromosomes.

In this example we can see that the litter consists of four puppies, two with CNV = 10 (5|5) and two with CNV = 6 (1|5). Using the light and dark blue coloured copies we can see which were inherited from the father (either the 5 or 1), and which were inherited from the mother (either the 5 or 5).

Dr Linda Tintle, a veterinarian with more than twenty years striving to improve the breed's welfare notes, "The wait for our first genetic test is over. We can now breed away from dogs with a CNV =10. These are the individuals most likely to suffer the debilitating signs of SPAID, including Shar-Pei Fever".

"This breed is incredibly special", says Dr Meadows. "The more we learn about the interplay between hyaluronan and the inflammatory immune response, the more we can contribute to both human and Shar-Pei health".

The test will be offered in Europe through SLU, Sweden with an American centre to follow shortly.

Deacon

Deacon was rescued from a home where he spent all the time outside. He has cherry eye in both eyes. Deacon made his way from SC to FL. On April 15th, he was neutered, vaccinated and found to be Heartworm Negative.

April 25th: Poor Deacon blew out his knee today. He was showing signs of patellar luxation before, but after playing rough, he is not able to complete bear weight on it, and the knee cap is clearly to the lateral side.

April 26th: Deacon will be having surgery tomorrow to repair his knee. He saw the orthopedic today and was found to have a torn meniscus, torn ACL, and a luxating patella. Following surgery he will require being kept quiet and relatively inactive for 6 to 8 weeks. His cherry eye surgery will have to be postponed until his recovery from tomorrow's surgery is complete.

Successful Rescues





Cruz (formerly Thirteen) came to MACSPRO from Brooklyn, NY thru the efforts of Nancy Berg. A referral from Sally Fionte directed a potential adopter to us who was looking for a dog around 2 years old. She set her sights on Cruz, a cream boy who was with a foster mom in Baltimore. Arrangements were made to have Cruz at the monthly MACSPRO Adoption Event in Olney MD. Allison (a former Pei owner) and her Mom Cindy, drove from Pearl River NY to meet him in Maryland. They immediately hit it off, but the meeting was cut short when their older dog who came with them to meet Cruz fell ill and had to go to the emergency vet. Unfortunately, their older dog passed over the Rainbow Bridge.

Allison & Cindy came back to Olney to take Cruz home with them to fill the space left by 2 dogs. Cruz settled right in at home in NY and is keeping them entertained with his antics & tricks.



Trixie: A Success Story

Trixie is a 12 week old female shar-pei, who came to us after being found on a golf course in central Florida. She was presumably injured and this injury resulted in nerve damage causing paralysis of her left front paw. Upon initial veterinary examination, after joining FSPR, she was found to have some pain in the left shoulder so the doctor believes that is likely where the injury occurred and this caused radial nerve paralysis. We have consulted with an orthopedic veterinary office and our next step is a neurology veterinarian to determine the extent of the damage and the best possible treatment plan. There is a possibility her left front leg will require amputation.



UPDATE #1: Trixie is now around 4 months old and has been evaluated by 2 neurologists. Unfortunately, the prognosis for saving her leg isn't a positive one. It is the recommendation of both neurologists that her leg be amputated due to nerve damage that cannot be reversed. Our final attempt to save Trixie's leg will be a consult with a prosthetics specialist who would like to make a brace if possible and avoid amputation.

UPDATE #2: After much contemplation and several professional consults, FSPR has decided it is in Trixie's best interest to move forward with amputation of her paralyzed left front leg. Her tentative surgery date is mid-March.

UPDATE #3: Trixie has had her surgery and it was successful. She is now on the road to recovery and has stolen many hearts along the way, including those of her foster family! It looks like Trixie has found her forever home right where she is. Her foster family has decided to adopt her.

Nationals Judges 2016 ~ Pending AKC Approval
