AKC says it is imperative when traveling with your dog, you carry a copy of its rabies certificate. Some states have a law that if you are pulled over or are at a rest stop and an officer asks to see the dog's certificate, you must present it, otherwise they can confiscate your dog. The dog doesn't have to be wearing the tag, they just need to see a copy of the certificate. Don't be caught without one.
