The CSPCA is a large and diverse organization with no paid employees. Therefore, the efforts of our volunteers are directly responsible for the success of our club and its programs. I believe it is an honor to be able to reward a CSPCA member for distinguished service.

Now it is your opportunity to follow suit and nominate another CSPCA member as YOUR Most Valued Member choice. This award is NOT just something to be passed around amongst friends, in fact is actually our hope that you do NOT do this. Instead, it is for that unsung hero who works for the CSPCA with their heart and soul, who has contributed their time, energy and efforts to the Club, our CSPCA, because of their love for the Breed and the Club which fosters it. It is for a person who is one of those folks who so often works very hard behind the scenes, not asking for or expecting recognition but working because they care, because it is just what they DO. ## ELECTRONIC BALLOT AUTHORIZATION



Please note that when the new bylaws were passed, it gave the club permission to do ballots electronically. It is a Delaware state law and AKC requirement to have a signed form from members saying they agree to receive their ballots electronically. You will find that authorization form on the website under Club Forms. We hope that most, if not all, of our club members will sign and return the form. Electronic balloting should speed up the balloting process and save money on mailing ballots.

Under electronic ballots, each voter is given a unique link to vote, or, in the alternative, can use a unique login code. Each code or link can only be used once. Voting can be completely anonymous. The

average cost is estimated at \$19 per 100 voters as opposed to \$75 per 100 for mailed ballots.

Anyone not signing up for Electronic Ballot Authorization will still get a mailed ballot.

## LONGEVITY PROGRAM REMINDER

We want to remind you about the Longevity Program. It is to recognize our Shar-Pei who have lived at least 10 years. As soon as a Shar-Pei turns 10, it becomes eligible. The list of dogs registered can be seen on the CSPCA website: <u>www.cspca.com</u>. You can participate by clicking on Health and Wellness, then Longevity Program, and a pop up menu gives you access to the application and information about the program. If you click on dog's name, breeder or owner, you will get a list of the dogs that are already in the program. I cordially invite members to fill out the application and mail the information to me, so that your dog's name can be added to this distinguished list. You will also receive a Longevity Certificate suitable for framing.

If your dog is already on the list, but is now deceased, please advise me of the date of death, so that I can make the necessary changes to the certificate number reflecting the number of months he/she lived. The "L" at the end of the Certificate # indicates the dog is living. The "D" at the end of the Certificate # indicates that the dog is deceased.

I look forward to hearing from you and having the opportunity to share the long life of your dog.

#### Letter to the Members

Any member who wants to suggest a hotel site for the 2024 NATIONALS <u>PLEASE DO SO BY NOVEMBER 15,2022</u> so the procurement committee can refer to our liaison at Helms Briscoe. #### ANY REQUESTS RECEIVED AFTER NOVEMBER 15TH WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE.

If you attended there may have been a miscommunication concerning the process obtaining venue bids for our Nationals. The Procurement Committee was established to oversee the policy and procedures for this process. In 2019 the policy was rewritten to state the following:

PURPOSE:

- To research and evaluate the ideal venue by a competitive bidding process
- To meet the best possible needs of the CSPCA
- Promote fair and open competition while minimizing risk

PROCESS: (The first two steps out of 14)

- 1. Notify club members by email that they may submit the name of a hotel to the Procurement Committee to have the Helms Briscoe associate include in their search.
- 2. On April 1<sup>st</sup>, the Procurement Committee will ask Helms Briscoe, a national procurement organization to begin the process of obtaining bids from the member's suggestions as well as their proprietary resources. Helms Briscoe will inform all candidate hotels the CSPCA reserves the right to choose the successful bidder without any obligation to the bidders except to respect the proprietary nature of their proposal. Helms Briscoe will have until April 15<sup>th</sup> to submit proposals to the Procurement Committee.

Due to the complexity of the entire process and to eliminate any confusion the revised Policy and Procedures took the member's out of the bidding process except to offer suggestions for venues.

The revised P & P was reviewed by the Board of Directors and acted upon with a unanimous vote at the March, 2020 meeting.

Unfortunately, we had an incident after Nationals where a member reached out to a venue that had already submitted a bid for 2024. This caused an embarrassing situation for the Helms Briscoe associate as well as our member.

In the future, please remember that you may submit any venues you consider a good fit for our Nationals to the Procurement Committee, and they will be forwarded to Helms Briscoe.

In addition, the CSPCA does not have any written contract with Helms Briscoe and there is no fee paid to Helms Briscoe by the CSPCA for their work. The final contract stipulates any commission paid to Helms Briscoe is the responsibility of the hotel/venue. Furthermore, the hotel cannot charge the CSPCA any stipends to cover the commission.
